HOW DO I PURCHASE TICKETS?

You will purchase all tickets for both in-cinema and FIN Stream online screenings, through finfestival2022.eventive.org/films. Links to purchase tickets can be found on each film's individual listing. Assigned seating is in effect for all in-cinema screenings. You will pick your seats online at time of purchase. This includes all Festival Pass and Ticket Package holders as well.

With assigned seating in effect, if you are coming to a screening with a companion or group, book your tickets at the same time to be sure you are able to get seats together. Once you choose your seats, you will not be able to change in-cinema as other seats may appear to be available but could have been chosen by others online.

Staff will be available for in-cinema support and can be found in Cineplex Cinemas Park Lane's lobby throughout the festival. Please note, we will not be selling or printing tickets in the theatre. All tickets need to be purchased in advance at finfestival2022.eventive.org/films

WHERE DO I WATCH THE FILMS? FIN STREAM ONLINE

Most Atlantic Canadian films will be available online through FIN Stream. Links to access the film(s) will be available once you've purchased a ticket. The program will be available over the full eight days of the festival, with the exception of Gala Presentations, which are only available during a 24-hour window, starting from their 7:00 pm in-cinema start times. After your ticket has been redeemed and you've pressed PLAY, you will have 24 hours to watch your film. During these 24 hours, you are able to watch your film as many times as you please before it expires.

Please note, if you are planning on watching the film more than once, you are not able to start your film on a different internet network than the one you originally were on when pressing PLAY. For example, if you started streaming your film at your house and decided you wanted to finish it with a friend, you wouldn't be able to restart the film at the second location. FIN AIFF IN-CINEMA

In addition to our Canadian and International selections, all FIN Stream Atlantic Canadian selections will also be available in-cinema.

All in-cinema screenings include assigned seating. For this reason, whether you are buying an individual ticket, or are a Festival Pass or Ticket Package holder, you will need to purchase a ticket for the screening before arriving at the theatre. After purchasing your ticket online through finfestival2022. eventive.org/films please bring your ticket(s) to the cinema to gain entrance. You may either print your ticket or bring them on your phone. As you will have selected your seat in advance, and to avoid queues outside of the auditorium, please do not arrive at the theatre any earlier than 15 minutes prior to your film start time. The doors will be open by that time and you'll be able to proceed directly to your pre-selected seat.

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






































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Brother

ABOUT THE ATLANTIC INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL AWARDS

JOAN ORENSTEIN

Joan Orenstein was a Britishborn Canadian actress of stage and screen, best known for her performance in the 1997 film The Hanging Garden (dir. Thom Fitzgerald) as Grace, the dotty old grandmother. Orenstein emigrated to Canada following World War II and eventually settled in Halifax, where she became a staple on the Neptune Theatre stage. An enormous talent we are proud to commemorate as part of the Outstanding Performance in Acting.

DAVID RENTON

David Renton was born in Geelong, Australia in 1934. In 1954 he emigrated to Canada and began to study and work with numerous companies across the country. Renton was a well-respected writer, director, actor, and producer, as well as highly engaged with a larger community through his work as an educator and arts administrator. It is our honour to commemorate him as part of the Outstanding Performance in Acting.

MICHAEL WEIR

Michael Weir was a visual artist, performer and film editor. He was twice nominated for the Academy of Canadian Cinema and Television Award (Genie) and was a recipient of numerous other honors including two awards for editing from the Atlantic Film Festival. In addition to his success as an editor, Michael was a director of several comedic short videos including the musical "Queer, Dyke, Fruit". He also documented his struggles with cancer in 36 hours of a profound video diary. He was much loved and we are very proud to present, with the support of the Michael Weir Foundation for the Arts, the Michael Weir Award for Best Atlantic Screenwriting.

GORDON PARSONS

Gordon Parsons was a driving force in the Atlantic Canada film industry. Some of Gordon's accomplishments include: Founding Wormwood's Cinema; assisting with the establishment of the Alliance of Film and Video; the Linda Joy Media Arts Society; the Motion Picture Heritage Fund of Nova Scotia, and the Nova Scotia chapter of the Association for Media Literacy. In addition, one of Gordon's most important accomplishments was working as the Executive Director of the Atlantic Film Festival.
