FIN Atlantic International Film Festival announces live-documentary *Africville in Black and White*, Sept. 18 in Halifax

(Halifax, NS) – **FIN Atlantic International Film Festival** is pleased to announce the Atlantic Canadian premiere of the site-specific live-documentary *Africville in Black and White* at St. Matthew's United Church (1479 Barrington Street) in Halifax on Tuesday, Sept. 18 at 7 p.m.

Set inside the church, *Africville in Black and White* traces the legacy, the spirit and the resilience of an African-Canadian community torn from their homes and forced to seek refuge within their own country. This story begins in the middle of the night 51 years ago when bulldozers destroyed the Seaview United Baptist Church - the heart and soul of the community.

Conceived, directed and produced by Gemini award-winning filmmaker Cyrus Sundar Singh, *Africville in Black and White* places the primary documentary subjects from the Africville community and diaspora in the presence of a live audience without the intervention of camera or screen. The direct relationship between the storyteller and the observer creates a unique experience where witnesses are complicit in co-creating the live-documentary. In addition, narrators, musicians, singers, poets, and dancers will also be gathered inside the church to "perform the documentary" in a collaborative, real-time experiment.

Produced by Salaam Shalom Productions and co-produced by Juanita Peters and San Family Productions, this live-documentary performance will take place inside St. Matthew's United Church, in downtown Halifax, with a remote connection to the Africville Church Museum located in the North End of Halifax.

Home to a tightly knit community of Black Canadians for over 150 years, Africville's legal residents were forcefully evicted, in the 1960s, by the city of Halifax and their homes bulldozed in the "name of progress."

"As Canada enters the next 150 years, *Africville in Black and White* offers the opportunity to reflect on the promise of an inclusive and multi-racial Canada, and how that notion includes or excludes the legacy of Africville, and Africanadians," said Sundar Singh.

"The Atlantic International Film Festival has always been about more than just films. It is about experiences and we feel honoured and privileged to be partnering up with Cyrus and his team for this incredible project", said Wayne Carter, Executive Director. "The Festival is all about telling stories and the Africville story is one of paramount importance."

A post-premiere reception for *Africville in Black and White* will be held at The Lord Nelson Hotel. Tickets are \$22.50 and the event is also open to FIN Big Binge and Daily Binge On Us pass holders.
